

Cal Pritner as Mark Twain: Two Shows

Actor Cal Pritner .is. Mark Twain. Twain's famous barbed wit, humorous observations of the detail of life and travel narratives are perfectly presented in Pritner's popular performance. Pritner has just completed a tour of his show *Mark Twain: Traveling* in California and Barbados and will appear in Ashland for the first time at the Annual Meeting of the Friends of the Ashland Public Library on Sunday February 28, 2010 at 2p.

This mostly comic, occasionally serious work celebrates Twain's decidedly irreverent thoughts on the people he met and the places he saw in a lifetime of world travel.

Don't miss Pritner's return performance on Monday March 1, 2010 at 7p

as Pritner embodies the spirit and struggles of Mark Twain in *Unlearning Racism*. A tough subject, even for 21st Century audiences, Pritner delves into Twain's racial attitudes and how they changed over the course of Twain's life.

Pritner is founding artistic director of the Illinois Shakespeare Festival and is an elected fellow of the prestigious College of Fellows of the American Theater. He's earned his stars on the stage as well as in television, film and the classroom.




Peggy and Parala: Our Dynamic Display Duo


