And not just with the healthy snacks she brings to the board meetings. Or with all the work she did making signs for the July 4th parade. (Her kindergarten penmanship was perfect for those tall banners – no one else could print as well.) Deb brought the Walker kindergarten class to the library and planted bulbs. She got us some wonderful outdoor planters and keeps them filled and healthy with very attractive and artistic plantings. Come see them just outside the library doors.

The next year the children came back and planted donated flowers outside the building. That's when we realized we had a problem. There was no outdoor watering system except around the trees! So Deb collected milk jugs and has been diligently coming in, filling them, and hand watering the plants. How many water jugs does it take? Twenty plus! We are working on getting this watering system changed but it's nice to have the summer almost over. (Anyone want to help water a day or two?)

Not only is she our gardener, but she's taken on the book sales.

Deb coordinates the ongoing book sales, separating out the more valuable books to be sold on-line, the nearly new ones to feature at the Third Tuesday sale, and sorting the rest for the shelves or giveaway table. She's always looking for others to help her. And while she's got a great crew more volunteers are al-

ways needed.

What can you do to volunteer at the Library?

✂ Annual November Book Sale and Silent Auction — Help sort and organize the books a few hours a week before the sale, collect silent auction items, sell books for the 2 days of the sale, help clean up). This will appeal to everyone wanting the satisfaction of creating order out of chaos.

✂ Host a special event or set of classes or film series. We would like to offer regular classes or films and we need a volunteer to run this. It could be 4 afternoons a month or once a month, whatever we can do to get things going. It's clean indoor work and you get to watch the movie while eating popcorn.
