Peace Wall Dedication

From the tatters of wind-torn peace banners hung on a fence in the Railroad District, an idea for a permanent Peace Fence Wall emerged. The original 2007 Peace



Fence, the inspiration of local artist Jean Bakewell, was a non-political expression of people's aspirations for peace and the planet's well-being. Thousands of visitors came to view over 200 peace panels, mostly made of fabric, created by artists and non-artists, including more than 180 Ashland school children. Weather ultimately took a toll on the panels.

A public art project approved and supported by the City of Ashland, the Friends of the Ashland Public Library and Peace House, the Peace Wall will be constructed as a ceramic tile mosaic mounted on a metal backing, the tiles replicating each of the original Peace Fence panels. The photo above illustrates how the new fence will be added to the existing retaining wall. A portion of the Wall will be dedicated at 5:30 pm on September 21, International Peace Day, in front of the Ashland Public Library. The event will include community speakers and poets and music by the Rogue Valley Peace Choir Ensemble. The public is invited to attend.

Chautauqua! On Thursday, October 29, Mark Doty, the only American poet to have won Great Britain's T. S. Eliot Prize, will speak at Ashland High School. He is a National Book Award winning poet and memoirist. The Friends of the Ashland Public Library help sponsor the Chautauqua Poets and Writers author series who are hosting his visit. It's that time—time to renew your membership for 2010 and recruit your friends to join us too.


